Personal and Possessive Pronouns – Reference Page

1. Personal subject pronouns:

- the subject of a sentence
- go before the main verb
- e.g. “she” in: “She had a cup of tea at eight o’clock this morning.”

2. Personal object pronouns:

- the object of a sentence (what the subject is talking about)
- go after the main verb
- e.g. “him” in: “I saw him for a few minutes before he left.”

3. Possessive adjectives:

- describe possession
- go before a noun
- e.g. “my” in: “Can you pass my bag please?”

4. Possessive pronouns:

- describe possession
- replace a noun
- e.g. “hers” in: “Whose book is that?” “It’s hers.”
